BOY SCOUTS OF AMERICA SCOUTER CODE OF CONDUCT

On my honor I promise to do my best to comply with this Boy Scouts of America Scouter Code of Conduct while serving in my capacity as an adult leader:

1. I have or will complete my registration with the Boy Scouts of America, answering all questions truthfully and honestly.
2. I will do my best to live up to the Scout Oath and Scout Law, obey all laws, and hold others in Scouting accountable to those standards. I will exercise sound judgment and demonstrate good leadership and use the Scouting program for its intended purpose consistent with the mission of the Boy Scouts of America.
3. I will make the protection of youth a personal priority. I will complete and remain current with youth protection training requirements. I will be familiar with and follow:
 - a. BSA youth protection policies and guidelines, including mandatory reporting:

4. When transporting Scouts I will obey all laws, comply with youth protection guidelines, and follow safe driving practices.
5. I will respect and abide by the Rules and Regulations of the Boy Scouts of America, BSA policies, and BSA-provided training, including but not limited to, those relating to:
 - a. Unauthorized fundraising activities
 - b. Advocacy on social and political issues, including prohibited use of the BSA uniform and brand
 - c. Bullying, hazing, harassment, and unlawful discrimination of any kind
6. I will not discuss or engage in any form of sexual conduct while engaged in Scouting activities. I will refer Scouts with questions regarding these topics to talk to their parents or spiritual advisor.
7. I confirm that I have fully disclosed and will disclose in the future any of the following:
 - a. Any criminal suspicion, charges or convictions of a crime or offense involving abuse, violence, sexual misconduct, or any misconduct involving minors or juveniles
 - b. Any investigation or court order involving domestic violence, child abuse, or similar matter
 - c. Any criminal charges or convictions for offenses involving controlled substances, driving while intoxicated, firearms or dangerous weapons.
8. I will not possess, distribute, transport, consume, or use any of the following items prohibited by law or in violation of any Scouting rules, regulations and policies:
 - a. Alcoholic beverages or controlled substances, including marijuana.
 - b. Concealed or unconcealed firearms, fireworks, or explosives.
 - c. Pornography or materials containing words or images inconsistent with Scouting values.
9. If I am taking prescription medications with the potential of impairing my functioning or judgment, I will not engage in activities which would put Scouts at risk, including driving or operating equipment.
10. I will take steps to prevent or report any violation of this code of conduct by others in connection with Scouting activities.

As a group, the Western Regional Youth Protection Task Force and the Western Region Key Three would like to thank you for all your efforts to bring the benefits of the Boy Scouts of America program to the youth in your communities. We know you share our commitment to make the Boy Scouts of America the premier youth serving organization in the Nation.

There is no more important part of the Scouting Program than the protection of all our youth members. We know you share our desire to make the Boy Scouts of America the premier youth *protection* organization in the Nation. Experience has proven the best way to accomplish this is to provide effective training on a continuing basis to all adults involved in Scouting at every level with no exceptions. Only when everyone is involved and trained in youth protection will we have achieved the safe environment that is critical to protecting our youth.

Gary Butler, Deputy Chief Scout Executive, captured the essence of what we must do when he said, "Youth Protection will become so engrained in the BSA culture that it is second in recognition only to the Scout Oath and Scout Law."

Accordingly, the Western Region Board has adopted the following policy change and goals:

Policy Changes effective immediately:

1. Current Youth Protection Training is ***mandatory*** for all new registrations or re-chartering.
2. Youth Protection Training must be completed ***annually***.

Goals:

1. 100% of all registered adults will be current in their youth protection training. To set an example, 100% of all Council Executive Board members will have current Youth Protection Training completed by June 30, 2015. The Region has led the way. Anyone serving on the Regional Board or any Committee, as well as the Leadership of all five Areas and all Area Committee Members, are current in their YPT.
2. Every Council will have a policy and plan to attain 100% Youth Protection Training put in place by June 30, 2015.

IMMEDIATE ACTION REQUIRED

The Boy Scouts of America (BSA) is committed first and foremost to keeping youth safe. Part of that commitment includes continually updating our youth protection policies to help ensure we are always on the forefront of youth safety.

As you know, one of the BSA's many barriers to abuse is a mandatory criminal background check during the adult volunteer application process. **The BSA will now also perform periodic rechecks of criminal backgrounds to support the continued safety of youth in our programs.**

Please complete the process listed below at your earliest availability to help us continue to provide the safest environment possible for our Scouts and leaders. **Please note that these steps must be completed before your 2020 annual registration can be processed.**

BUILDING A FINANCIALLY SUSTAINABLE PROGRAM THROUGH AN ANNUAL SUPPORT FEE

The Program Support Fee will replace the annual family Friends of Scouting (FOS) campaign. To ensure that *no scout will be denied our program due to ability to pay*, we have incorporated mechanisms for members to cover this charge either with payment at the time of recharter, or through product sales.

Frequently Asked Questions:

Q1. What will be the total cost per registered youth and adult member? A.

The total cost at the time of this year's recharter:

Q2. I am a Scout Leader/Advisor to an Explorer Post; do I have to pay the Program Support Fee? A. Adults will not be charged the Council Program Support Fee. We want as many trained adults in our programs working with their kids. What this revision means is that we need everyone to get on board and support the Council. When you participate in council-sponsored unit revenue generating programs such as Popcorn & Camp Cards, and attend in-Council camps, you are helping to minimize the cost of Scouting for everyone in the Greater Los Angeles Area Council..

Q3. Doesn't the annual BSA registration fee cover the needs of the council?

A. The \$60 national registration fee goes directly to the National Boy Scouts of America which develops and supports the Scouting program Nationwide. No portion of the fee goes toward local (Los Angeles Area) council program support.

Q4. Why is this additional Program Support Fee necessary? A. It costs GLAAC \$450 to keep one Scout in our program for a year! We have implemented significant cost cutting measures starting in 2015, to be one of the leanest councils in BSA. Unit dues and national registration do not support this cost. Our Board must raise over eight million dollars to operate our camps and provide program support across the Greater Los Angeles area.

Q5. How will the Program Support Fee be used?

A. These funds will be used for recruiting members, training leaders, developing and operating camps and for program activities. They provide support for unit registration, advancement, membership, and to maintain our Council Camps, Service Centers and stores. Basically, all program features that would be originally supported by Friends of Scouting contributions are now covered by the Program Support Fee.

Q6. How will the Program Support Fee be collected? A. The program support fee will be collected at the time of re-charter. A worksheet will be included in your re-charter packet. Starting in 2020, it will be included in the member registration fees and collected at the same time as registration.

Q7a. What about families in need? An additional \$36 is a lot to ask.

- A. If a family cannot afford \$36, the Pack, Troop, Crew, Ship or Post can:
- I. Opt to pay the Program Support Fees on the family's behalf.
 - II. Participate in Council Product Sales or Unit Money Earning Projects to help raise the funds to pay the fees.
 - III. Participate in Camp Card II program (only for Fall of 2019).
 - IV. Any family unable to pay the Program Support Fee may apply for scholarship or financial assistance.

No scout will be denied our program due to inability to pay.

Q7b. What is the Camp Card II program? A. The Camp Card II program will be a one-time special promotion through the end of the year. If a unit chooses to participate in the Camp Card II program, they will receive 10 camp cards for free (retail value \$5 per card), for each registrant who is unable to pay the Program

Support Fee. Each registrant will then sell the 10 camp cards to generate the \$36 Program Support Fee. Payment is due with Re-Charter.

Q8. Why should I pay more for dues? I didn't pay last year, and all the camps and events still took place.

A. The council has been using its savings for years as it has dealt with increased costs and a decreasing number of donors. The council has tried to avoid asking for a larger contribution from families by reducing its staff and taking other cost-savings measures. Despite all of this, we still don't have a balanced budget and the decision was made to ask members to contribute more of the real cost of Scouting.

Q9. Don't camp fees and activity revenue cover the cost of Scouting?

A. Camping and activity revenue do not cover the cost to maintain our camps. We lose approximately \$650,000 annually in our camps. In the past two years we have still invested over \$2,000,000 in Hubert Eaton Scout Reservation and Camp Cherry Valley. No other council in the Western Region can say the same. We are working hard to maintain and improve our camps by identifying outside donors.

Q10a. What happens to the Friends of Scouting campaign? A. While our annual campaigns, fundraisers and special events (e.g., Business Leaders' Breakfast), etc. will continue, Friends of Scouting presentations at the units will cease. But, if a unit or individual chooses to, there will still be opportunities to support the annual giving campaign and gifts can be applied to help defray the cost of the program fee for families that cannot afford it.

Q10b. How will units or individual donors be able to continue giving to Friends of Scouting, if they would like to? A. We have online portals available for submitting donations to the Annual Giving Campaign. As well as live events such as the Council's Business Leader's Breakfast and Good Character Gala. Districts will also have community fundraising events that donors can be invited to.

Q11. Are we the only council with a Program Fee? A. Nearly half of the Councils nationwide are instituting or have already instituted a similar Program Fee; some as high as a \$150. Many others are considering it as families have stated a preference to paying up front fees rather than rely on fundraising such as Friends of Scouting.

BUILDING A FINANCIALLY SUSTAINABLE PROGRAM THROUGH AN ANNUAL SUPPORT FEE

Q12. How are we the one of the leanest Councils in the BSA? A. We have implemented significant cost cutting measures since 2016 to help off-set the revenue shortfalls. In 2017 we reduced of our staff by 1/3 and implemented salary cuts ranging from 3% to 15%. In 2018 we sold Holcomb Valley Scout Reservation and permanently closed Log Cabin Wilderness Camp.

Q13. I am a Scout Leader and an Advisor to an Explorer Post; do I have to pay the Program Support Fee? A. No, you will not be charged the Program Support Fee. What this revision means is that we need everyone to get on board and support the Council. Support our Unit revenue generating programs (Products Sales) and attend in-Council camps. Unit leaders will only be charged insurance in 2020, while youth members will pay both insurance and program fees.

Q14. Our Troop has Eagle Candidates that are only registering for 2020 to finish their Eagle Character Board in January or February. Do they also have to pay the Program Support Fee? A. All youth members will be required to pay the program support fee. Eagle Scouts may continue to fully participate in the program until age 18 for Scouts BSA and age 21 for Venturing.

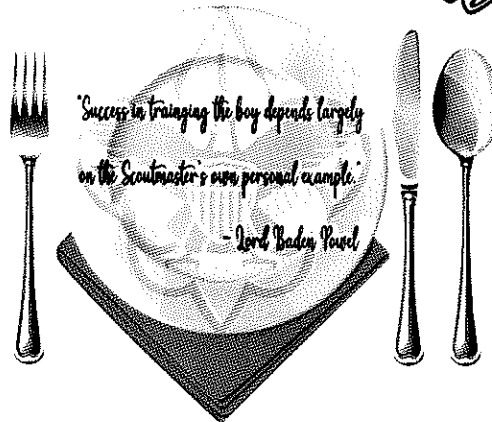

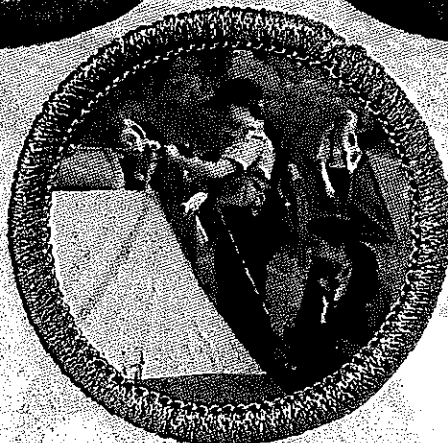

Here at the Greater Los Angeles Area Council we're dedicated to serving the youth of our communities through our many programs. What are volunteer grant programs?

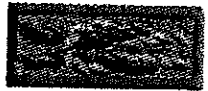

The new Cub Scouting position training is now available. There are three sections to each position training; Before Your First Meeting, Before Your First Outdoor Adventure, and Earning Your Trained Patch. Completion of these three sections for the positions of Den Leader and Assistant Den Leader, Cubmaster and Assistant Cubmaster, Pack Committee Member, and Pack Committee Chair meets the requirement to be position specific trained and entitles you to wear the trained patch below your position patch. Modules have been updated with the current Cub Scout program, time to complete modules has been greatly reduced, and once a module is completed for one position it also counts for other positions in Cub Scouting. For example, a volunteer who completes position specific training for Den Leader and then becomes Cubmaster only has to take one 12 minute module to be position specific trained as Cubmaster.
